Cheshire April 12th 1819 Then before Elisha Huntly
Justice of the Court of Common Pleas for said
County of Cheshire personally appeared Issachar
Mayo within named and made solemn oath
that the within declaration by him subscribed
contains the truth ~~and~~ nothing but the
truth and it having been made to appear to my
satisfaction that the said Issachar Mayo did
serve in the revolutionary war against the Common
Enemy in manner as by him is stated in said
Declaration also that by reason of his reduced
circumstances he stands in need of the assistance
of his Country for support which I hereby certify
to the Honble John C. Ballou
Secretary war

I Isaac Mays of Newworth in the County of
Shropshire and State of New Hampshire Husbandman
do make the following Declaration upon oath -
That in the year of our Lord ~~1776~~ One Thousand Seven
Hundred and Seventy five in the month of November
I enlisted as a private Soldier in the Continental Army
in the United States of America at Harwich in the
County of Barnstable and Commonwealth of
Massachusetts under Capt Peter Harwood and in
Capt Larnard's Regiment for the term of one year
in the Massachusetts line and Marched to Roxbury
where we continued until the April following when
we Marched to the City of New York where Capt
Harwood's Company was taken to ^{help} guard the North West
where we remained until the last of December 1776
when I was discharged from any further duty but
had no other discharge

Also I further say upon oath that by reason of my
Reduced Circumstances I stand in need of the Assistance
of my Country for Support - Isaac Mays
I am Sixty five years of age -
